

Consumer Price Index

July 2025

Information released today by Statistics Canada indicates the Yellowknife All-Items Consumer Price Index in July rose by 2.0% compared to one year ago. By comparison, annual prices increased by 1.7% for Canada, 1.2% for Edmonton, 2.9% for Whitehorse, and 0.4% for Iqaluit.

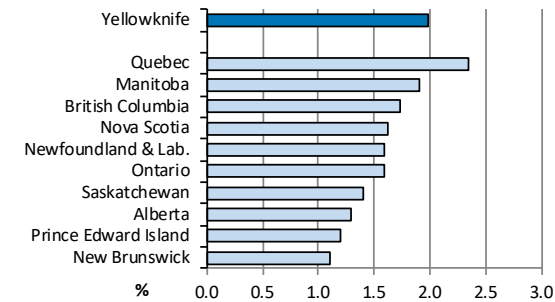
Consumer prices increased for all provinces in July 2025 compared to a year ago. New Brunswick had the lowest increase (1.1%) while Quebec had the highest (2.3%).

In Yellowknife, consumer prices rose in six of the eight major components compared to one year ago including food (3.8%) and shelter (3.5%).

Prices for many grocery store items rose year-over-year between July 2024 and July 2025. Fish and seafood increased by more than 8%, fruits and nuts rose by over 6%, while meat and dairy and eggs were up by around 4%. Food from restaurants also rose by 5.5% during the same period.

Looking at energy and its components, both gasoline and fuel oil & other fuels decreased by 12.1% and 8%, respectively. In contrast, electricity increased by 3.2% over the last 12 months.

Yellowknife, July 2024 to July 2025

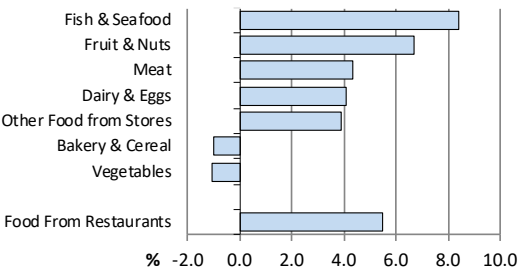
