

Consumer Price Index

June 2016

OVERVIEW

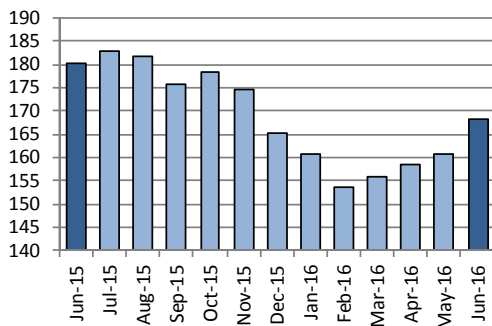
Information released today by Statistics Canada indicates that the Yellowknife All-Items Consumer Price Index in June rose 0.9% compared to one year ago. By comparison, the annual price increase was 1.5% for Canada, 1.6% for Edmonton, 1.2% for Whitehorse and 2.2% for Iqaluit.

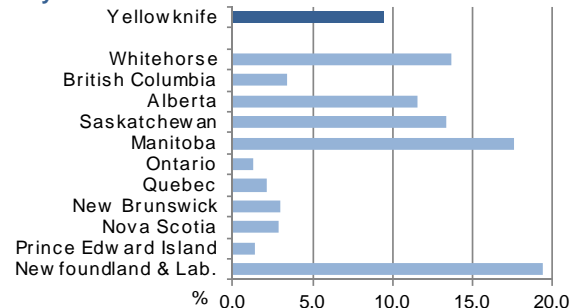

Compared to June 2015, prices increased in Yellowknife for most major components with the exception of shelter and recreation, reading & education. Food saw the largest increase, rising by 3.5% while energy products fell by 6.5% since June 2015.

While the price of energy products are lower than 12 months ago, they have steadily increased since February 2016, most recently rising by 4.7% between May and June 2016. This monthly increase was comprised of a 5.8% rise in fuel oil and other fuels and a 9.4% increase in gasoline, while electricity experienced no change. Gasoline prices have risen across Canada between May and June 2016 with Manitoba and Newfoundland & Labrador experiencing the largest increase.
