
Consumer Price Index – June 2018 -

Information released today by Statistics Canada indicates that the Yellowknife All-Items Consumer Price Index in June rose by 1.9% compared to one year ago. By comparison, the annual price increase was 2.5% for Canada, 3.1% for Edmonton, 2.9% for Whitehorse and 2.7% for Iqaluit.

Compared to June 2017, transportation experienced the largest increase, rising by 5.5% over the last 12 months. The increase was spurred by higher prices for public transportation which includes airline travel. Shelter also rose over the same period, mostly as a result of the 8.6% price increase in water, fuel and electricity.



The graph shows that most of the overall price increase over the last 12 months occurred between November 2017 and February 2018. Since then prices have been relatively stable and increased by 0.1% between May and June 2018.
