Consumer Price Index

June 2020

During the past few months, COVID-19 has restricted the movement of people and forced many businesses to change their normal operations. This affected how Statistics Canada conducted the Consumer Price Index in June; in-person data collection was done remotely, supplemented with alternate data sources, and a higher level of data imputation occurred due to the reduced availability of some products and services.


Statistics Canada indicates that in June 2020 the Yellowknife All-Items Consumer Price Index rose by 0.1% compared to one year ago. By comparison, the annual price change in June was 0.7% for Canada, 1.4% for Edmonton, 0.1% for Whitehorse and -0.6% for Iqaluit. The slight increase in Yellowknife follows two consecutive annual declines in both April and May.

Between June 2019 and June 2020, Yellowknife consumer prices decreased in four of the eight major components. Shelter contributed to the decline, largely a result the 12.8% decline in water, fuel and electricity.


Fuel oil & other fuels declined by 32.8% between June 2019 and June 2020 while electricity prices remained the same over this period. Gasoline fell by 20.8% resulting in an overall decrease of 17.4% in energy prices.

While energy prices have trended downward since the start of 2020, they increased by 5.8% between May 2020 and June 2020. The monthly increase in both gasoline and fuel oil & other fuels contributed to the 1.2% increase in the Yellowknife CPI between May and June.
