# Consumer Price Index June 2025

Information released today by Statistics Canada indicates the Yellowknife All-Items Consumer Price Index in June rose by 2.6% compared to one year ago. By comparison, annual prices increased by 1.9% for Canada, 1.7% for Edmonton, 2.8% for Whitehorse, and 0.9% for Iqaluit.

In comparing Yellowknife consumer prices to the provinces, Yellowknife had the largest year-over-year increase. All provinces experienced price increases ranging from 2.2% in Manitoba to 0.8% in Prince Edward Island.

In Yellowknife, consumer prices rose in six of the eight major components compared to one year ago including food (5.4%), shelter (3.9%) and clothing & footwear (3.6%).

The increase in food prices included fish & seafood, meat, and fruit & nuts, all rising by over 8% between June 2024 and June 2025. Food from restaurants rose by 6.0% over the same period.

Looking at energy and its components, both gasoline and fuel oil & other fuels decreased by 11.6% and 6.7%, respectively. In contrast, electricity increased by 3.2% over Ot the last 12 months.
