Consumer Price Index

March 2020

Today Statistics Canada released information from the Consumer Price Index (CPI) for the month of March. The majority of prices reflected in this release were collected prior to the interventions due to COVID-19.

Statistics Canada indicates that in March 2020 the Yellowknife All-Items Consumer Price Index rose by 1.1% compared to one year ago. By comparison, the annual price increase was 0.9% for Canada, 0.9% for Edmonton, 2.7% for Whitehorse and 1.7% for Iqaluit.

Between March 2019 and March 2020, Yellowknife consumer prices increased for most major components with the exception of household operations & furnishings and health and personal care. Shelter and food experienced the largest increases, rising by 2.0% and 1.9% respectively, while energy products declined by 5.2% over the 12 month period. The annual decline in energy products was a result of decreases in gasoline (10.4) and fuel oil and other fuels (7.6) while electricity rose by 1.5%.

Canada & Yellowknife, 2000/01 to 2019/20




Figure 1 shows how prices change from one fiscal year to the next based on a 12-month average index (ending March 31). Governments tend to use this annual inflation rate to evaluate the prices of their goods and services.

The 2019/20 fiscal year inflation rate for Yellowknife was 1.8%, dropping from 2.2% the previous year. In comparison, the Canadian inflation rate decreased to 2.0% in 2019/20 from 2.1% in 2018/19.
