Consumer Price Index May 2025

Information released today by Statistics Canada indicates the Yellowknife All-Items Consumer Price Index in May rose by 1.7% compared to one year ago. By comparison, annual prices increased by 1.7% for Canada, 1.6% for Edmonton, 3.1% for Whitehorse, and 1.1% for Igaluit.


Consumer prices increased for all provinces in May 2025 compared to a year ago. Newfoundland & Labrador had the lowest increase (0.5%) while British Columbia had the highest (2.3%).

In Yellowknife, year-over-year consumer prices rose in three of the eight major components including food (4.2%), and shelter (4.6%).

Prices for numerous grocery store items increased year-over-year, including fruit & nut, meat, fish & seafood. Food from restaurants increased by 7.7% between May 2024 and May 2025.

Looking at energy and its components, both gasoline and fuel oil & other fuels decreased by 12.4% and 6.9% respectively over the last 12 months. In contrast, electricity increased by 12.9% over the same period.

Percentage Change in Food by Subcomponent Yellowknife, May 2024 to May 2025


