

Consumer Price Index – November 2013

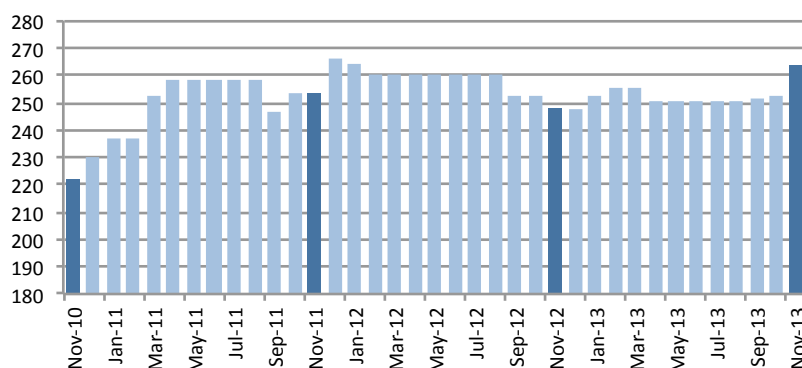
Information released today by Statistics Canada indicates that the Yellowknife All-Items Consumer Price Index rose 1.4% from November 2012. By comparison, the annual price increase was 0.9% for Canada, 1.3% for Edmonton and 1.2% for Whitehorse.

The annual price increase in Yellowknife was primarily due to higher prices for shelter and food. The most notable increase over the last 12 months was for shelter (3.0%), a result of higher electricity prices (4.7%) and fuel oil & other fuels (heating oil) prices (6.3%). The majority of the fuel price increase over the last year occurred between October and November 2013.

Other notable price increases last month included food from stores, personal care, and clothing accessories & jewellery.

CPI values for Yellowknife and Whitehorse include estimates of price changes for owned accommodation based on the price of rental accommodation. As a result, the all-items indexes published for these centers are not strictly comparable to those for Canada and Edmonton.
