Consumer Price Index

November 2023

Information released today by Statistics Canada indicates the Yellowknife All-Items Consumer Price Index in November rose by 1.4% compared to one year ago. This is the lowest year-over-year change in Yellowknife since June 2021. By comparison, annual prices increased by 3.1% for Canada, 2.2% for Edmonton, 3.0% for Whitehorse and 1.8% for Igaluit.



Since peaking at 8.3% during June 2022, the year-over-year inflation rate for Yellowknife has slowed to under 2%. While the Inflation rate for food has also slowed, food prices remain elevated. In November 2023, food in Yellowknife was 7.6% higher than November 2022.

Year-over-year increases were also observed for shelter (4.3%) and health & personal care (2.7%). These increases were partially offset by a decline in household operations & furnishings prices, which dropped by -12.2% between November 2022 and November 2023.

November 2023 inflation in Yellowknife was lower than most Canadian provinces. Among provinces, the annual price increase ranged from a low of 0.4% in Prince Edward Island to 3.6% in Quebec.

Percentage Change in Prices - All Items November 2022 to November 2023


