

Consumer Price Index

November 2025

Information released today by Statistics Canada indicates the Yellowknife All-Items Consumer Price Index in November rose by 2.1% compared to one year ago. By comparison, annual prices increased by 2.2% for Canada, 1.7% for Edmonton, 2.9% for Whitehorse, and 1.4% for Iqaluit.

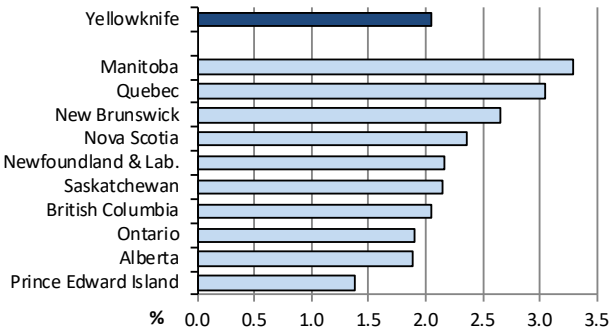
Consumer prices increased for all provinces between November 2024 and November 2025. Prince Edward Island had the lowest increase (1.4%) while Manitoba had the highest (3.3%).

In Yellowknife, consumer prices rose in five of the eight major components over the 12-month period with the highest increases in food (4.0%) and shelter (3.5%).

Prices increased in most grocery items since November 2024. Meat had the highest year-over-year increase (12.0%), followed by fruit & nuts. In contrast, food from restaurants decreased by 1.5% during the same period.

Looking at energy and its components, both gasoline and fuel oil & other fuels decreased by 11.3% and 6.9%, respectively. In contrast, electricity increased by 1.4% over the last 12 months.

Yellowknife, November 2024 to November 2025

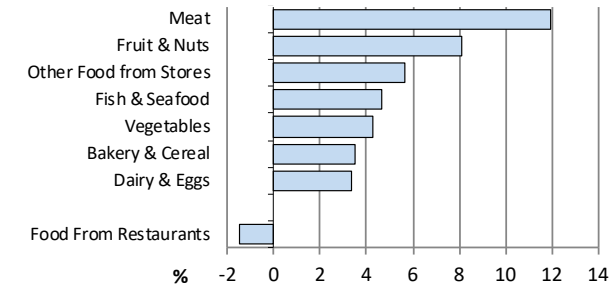
