Consumer Price Index – October 2018 -

Information released today by Statistics Canada indicates that the Yellowknife All-Items Consumer Price Index in October rose by 3.1% compared to one year ago. By comparison, the annual price increase was 2.4% for Canada, 3.0% for Edmonton, 2.9% for Whitehorse and 2.1% for Igaluit.




Compared to October 2017, prices rose in Yellowknife for most major components with the exception of food and household operations & furnishings. Transportation experienced the largest increase, rising by 6.8%, while shelter also increased, rising by 4.5%. The increase in transportation can in part be explained by higher gasoline prices, while an increase in fuel oil and other fuels contributed to the increase in shelter.

Gasoline prices rose by 27.4% between October 2017 and October 2018, with the majority of the increase occurring since April. The 17.8% increase in fuel oil and other fuels began earlier. In contrast to these increases, the price of electricity decreased by 0.3% from October 2017.
