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Consumer Price Index

October 2019

Information released today by Statistics Canada indicates that the Yellowknife All-Items Consumer Price Index in October rose by 1.4% compared to one year ago. By comparison, the annual price increase was 1.9% for Canada, 1.6% for Edmonton, 2.2% for Whitehorse and 1.5% for Iqaluit.



Between October 2018 and October 2019, Yellowknife consumer prices increased for most major components with the exception of household operations & furnishings and health & personal care.

Food experienced the largest increase, rising by 2.8%. This increase was largely a result of higher prices for meat, with fish & seafood and vegetables also contributing to the rise. Dairy & eggs as well as bakery & cereal products were the only food subcomponents to experience a decline over the last 12 months. The increase in food prices were not unique to Yellowknife. Food prices increased the most in the western provinces and Prince Edward Island, while Newfoundland & Labrador experienced the lowest growth in food prices between October 2018 and October 2019.

Percentage Change in Prices - Food October 2018 to October 2019


