## **Consumer Price Index** October 2024

Information released today by Statistics Canada indicates the Yellowknife All-Items Consumer Price Index in October rose by 2.4% compared to one year ago. By comparison, annual prices increased by 2.0% for Canada, 2.9% for Edmonton, 2.2% for Whitehorse and 1.5% for Igaluit.

Consumer prices increased for all provinces in October 2024 compared to a year ago. Manitoba and Newfoundland & Labrador had the lowest increase (1.1%) while Alberta had the highest (3.0%).


In Yellowknife, year-over-year consumer prices rose in six of the eight major components including shelter (3.0%), and food (5.8%).

Prices for numerous grocery store items increased year-overyear, including vegetables, fruit & nuts and meat. Food from restaurants increased by 8.3% between October 2023 and October 2024.

Looking at energy and its components, both gasoline and fuel oil and other fuels declined by 3.2% and 13.7% respectively over the last 12 months. In contrast, electricity prices rose 7.6% over the same period.


### **Percentage Change in Prices - All Items** October 2023 to October 2024
