

Consumer Price Index

October 2025

Information released today by Statistics Canada indicates the Yellowknife All-Items Consumer Price Index in October rose by 1.7% compared to one year ago. By comparison, annual prices increased by 2.2% for Canada, 1.4% for Edmonton, 3.1% for Whitehorse, and 1.0% for Iqaluit.

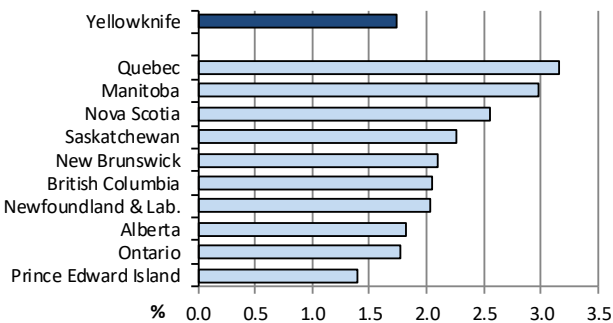
Consumer prices increased for all provinces in October 2025 compared to a year ago. Prince Edward Island had the lowest increase (1.4%) while Quebec had the highest (3.2%).

In Yellowknife, consumer prices rose in six of the eight major components compared to one year ago including food (0.9%), shelter (3.8%), and health & personal care (3.7%).

Prices for many grocery items rose year-over-year between October 2024 and October 2025. Meat increased more than 9% while fruit & nuts increased by 3%. These increases were partially offset by lower prices for bakery & cereal products (-1.0%) and vegetables (-6.8%). Food from restaurants decreased by 2.1% during the same period.

Looking at energy and its components, both gasoline and fuel oil & other fuels decreased by 10.6% and 7.0%, respectively. In contrast, electricity increased by 3.5% over the last 12 months.

Yellowknife, October 2024 to October 2025

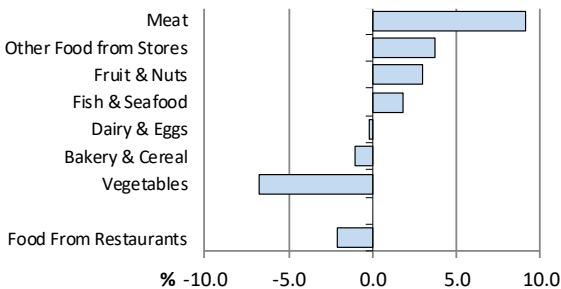
