

Consumer Price Index September 2024

Information released today by Statistics Canada indicates the Yellowknife All-Items Consumer Price Index in September rose by 1.2% compared to one year ago. By comparison, annual prices increased by 1.6% for Canada, 1.8% for Edmonton, 1.8% for Whitehorse and 1.5% for Iqaluit.


Consumer prices increased for all provinces in September 2024 compared to a year ago. Saskatchewan and Newfoundland & Labrador had the lowest increase (0.7%) while British Columbia had the highest (2.0%).

In Yellowknife, year-over-year consumer prices rose in five of the eight major components including shelter (3.1%), and food (1.8%). Items recording a decline were household operations & furnishings (1.3%), transportation (1.3%) and clothing & footwear (1.0%).

Looking at energy and its components, both gasoline and fuel oil and other fuels declined by 2.5% and 15.2% respectively over the last 12 months. In contrast, electricity prices rose 7.6% between September 2023 and September 2024.


Since peaking last November, fuel oil and other fuels declined early last year and has remained steady over the spring and summer.
